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Care and Maintenance of your Cultured Stone Products

Preserve the lustre by occasionally cleaning and waxing your product. Use a cloth with liquid or spray cleaners as directed on the label. Most bathroom cleaners will specify that they are safe to use on Cultured Stone/Cultured Marble. Do not clean with abrasive cleaners, hard bristle brushes, scouring pads, or steel wool.

To maintain the glossy finish of your product and make cleaning even easier, Gel Gloss can be applied to your surface after cleaning. Please note that products with a Matte finish do not need to be polished.

Diluted bleach can be used, but never let the cultured stone product come in contact with pure bleach.

To get rid of built up hairspray, paint, tar, etc. use turpentine, paint thinner or acetone (which can commonly be found in nail polish remover). Hard water build-up can often come clean with a mild solution of diluted vinegar.

To get rid of built-up soap scum and 'foot-dirt' on your shower base, Vim cream can be used very occasionally with a soft bristle brush. Vim cream is an abrasive cleaner, meaning prolonged over-use will dull the finish and eventually make the base more difficult to keep clean.

Keep tap water below 125°F/50°C to avoid 'Crazing' around the sink drain.

Certain chemical substances can seriously mar your cultured stone surface, even during brief periods of contact. Protect the surface from contact with these harmful products:

- Pure bleach
- Drano or Lye solutions
- Sani-flush or other Sodium Bisulfate compounds
- Plumber's Putty
- Comet, AJAX or other abrasive cleaners
